



STATISTICS FOR POVERTY MAP

- Approximately 2.6 billion people are living on less than two dollars a day.
- Over 1.4 billion people in the developing world live below the poverty line (U.S.\$1.25 per day).

Africa

Burkina Faso

- Population: 15,264,735
- 57% of the population lives below the poverty line.
- 77% of the population is unemployed.
- Life expectancy — male: 51 years, female: 54 years
- Infant mortality: 86/1,000 live births

Ethiopia

- Population: 82,544,840
- 39% of the population lives below the poverty line.
- Unemployment rates unavailable as most work is agricultural, and therefore seasonal.
- Life expectancy — male: 53 years, female: 58 years
- Infant mortality: 83/1,000 live births

Ghana

- Population: 23,382,848
- 30% of the population lives below the poverty line.
- 11% of the population is unemployed.
- Life expectancy — male: 77 years, female: 60 years
- Infant mortality: 52/1,000 live births

Kenya

- Population: 37,953,840
- 20% of the population lives below the poverty line.
- 40% of the population is unemployed.
- Life expectancy — male: 56 years, female: 57 years
- Infant mortality: 56/1,000 live births

Rwanda

- Population: 10,186,063
- 77% of the population lives below the poverty line.
- Unemployment rates unavailable as most work is agricultural, and therefore seasonal.
- Life expectancy — male: 49 years, female: 51 years
- Infant mortality: 83/1,000 live births

Tanzania

- Population: 40,213,160
- 88% of the population lives below the poverty line.
- Unemployment rates unavailable as most work is agricultural, and therefore seasonal.
- Life expectancy — male: 50 years, female: 53 years
- Infant mortality: 70/1,000 live births

Togo

- Population: 5,858,673
- 39% of the population lives below the poverty line.
- Unemployment rates unavailable as most work is agricultural, and therefore seasonal.
- Life expectancy — male: 56 years, female: 60 years
- Infant mortality: 58/1,000 live births

Uganda

- Population: 31,367,972
- 52% of the population lives below the poverty line.
- Unemployment rates unavailable as most work is agricultural, and therefore seasonal.
- Life expectancy — male: 51 years, female: 53 years
- Infant mortality: 66/1,000 live births

Asia

Bangladesh

- Population: 153,546,896
- 50% of the population lives below the poverty line.
- 2.5% of the population is unemployed.
- Life expectancy — male: 63 years, female: 63 years
- Infant mortality: 57/1,000 live births

India

- Population: 1,147,995,904
- 42% of the population lives below the poverty line.
- 6.8% of the population is unemployed.
- Life expectancy — male: 67 years, female: 72 years
- Infant mortality: 32/1,000 live births

Indonesia

- Population: 237,512,352
- 21% of the population lives below the poverty line.
- 8.2% of the population is unemployed.
- Life expectancy — male: 68 years, female: 73 years
- Infant mortality: 31/1,000 live births

Philippines

- Population: 96,061,680
- 23% of the population lives below the poverty line.
- 7.4% of the population is unemployed.
- Life expectancy — male: 68 years, female: 74 years
- Infant mortality: 21/1,000 live births

Thailand

- Population: 65,493,296
- Less than 1% of the population lives below the poverty line.
- 1.4% of the population is unemployed.
- Life expectancy — male: 71 years, female: 75 years
- Infant mortality: 18/1,000 live births

Middle America

Dominican Republic

- Population: 9,507,133
- 5% of the population lives below the poverty line.
- 15.4% of the population is unemployed.
- Life expectancy — male: 72 years, female: 75 years
- Infant mortality: 27/1,000 live births

El Salvador

- Population: 7,066,403
- 14% of the population lives below the poverty line.
- 6.4% of the population is unemployed.
- Life expectancy — male: 68 years, female: 76 years
- Infant mortality: 22/1,000 live births

Guatemala

- Population: 13,002,206
- 12% of the population lives below the poverty line.
- 3.2% of the population is unemployed.
- Life expectancy — male: 68 years, female: 72 years
- Infant mortality: 29/1,000 live births

Haiti

- Population: 8,924,553
- 55% of the population lives below the poverty line.
- 67% of the population is unemployed.
- Life expectancy — male: 56 years, female: 59 years
- Infant mortality: 62/1,000 live births

Honduras

- Population: 7,639,327
- 22% of the population lives below the poverty line.
- 27.8% of the population is unemployed.
- Life expectancy — male: 68 years, female: 71 years
- Infant mortality: 25/1,000 live births

Mexico

- Population: 109,955,400
- Less than 2% of the population lives below the poverty line.
- 4.1% of the population is unemployed.
- Life expectancy — male: 73 years, female: 79 years
- Infant mortality: 19/1,000 live births

Nicaragua

- Population: 5,785,846
- 16% of the population lives below the poverty line.
- 3.9% of the population is unemployed.
- Life expectancy — male: 69 years, female: 73 years
- Infant mortality: 26/1,000 live births

South America

Bolivia

- Population: 9,247,816
- 20% of the population lives below the poverty line.
- 7.5% of the population is unemployed.
- Life expectancy — male: 64 years, female: 69 years
- Infant mortality: 49/1,000 live births

Brazil

- Population: 196,342,592
- 8% of the population lives below the poverty line.
- 8% of the population is unemployed.
- Life expectancy — male: 68 years, female: 75 years
- Infant mortality: 23/1,000 live births

Colombia

- Population: 45,013,672
- 15% of the population lives below the poverty line.
- 11.8% of the population is unemployed.
- Life expectancy — male: 69 years, female: 76 years
- Infant mortality: 20/1,000 live births

Ecuador

- Population: 13,927,650
- 10% of the population lives below the poverty line.
- 8.7% of the population is unemployed.
- Life expectancy — male: 74 years, female: 80 years
- Infant mortality: 21/1,000 live births

Peru

- Population: 29,180,900
- 8% of the population lives below the poverty line.
- 8.3% of the population is unemployed.
- Life expectancy — male: 69 years, female: 72 years
- Infant mortality: 30/1,000 live births
